a. The subject matter on which the expert is expected to testify:

1. Principles of psychiatry and psychiatric care, including but not limited to those specifically dealing with depression, suicidality, suicidal and homicidal ideation, and behavioral health care generally;
2. Diagnostic and prognostic considerations with respect to individuals suffering from depression and/or medical problems;
3. Evaluation, treatment, monitoring, and appropriate precautions for patients with suicidal and/or homicidal ideations;
4. The care and treatment provided to Brent Slone at Commonwealth Pain Associates, PLLC;
5. The suicide of Brent Slone on September 12, 2017; and
6. The expert testimony and opinions offered on behalf of Plaintiff and the basis, therefore.

b. Substance of the facts and opinions as to which Dr. Noffsinger is expected to testify:

1. That the staff at Commonwealth Pain Associates, PLLC met the standard of care in their care and treatment of Brent Slone;
2. That Commonwealth Pain Associates, PLLC nurses and personnel, appropriately and reasonably assessed Brent Slone at the clinic, given his clinical presentation and the symptoms related by him;
3. That the Commonwealth staff took appropriate steps to communicate with Dr. Young and Dr. Jackson and that they took appropriate precautions in light of those concerns;
4. That Commonwealth had no reason to anticipate or foresee that Brent Slone would commit suicide; and
5. That no action or inaction of the staff at Commonwealth Pain Associates, PLLC caused or contributed to cause Brent Slone's subsequent suicide.

c. The above opinions will be based upon:

1. Dr. Noffsinger's education, training and experience;
2. Dr. Noffsinger's treatment and diagnosis of similar conditions and presentations;
3. Dr. Noffsinger's understanding and familiarity with the relevant medical literature.

4. Defendant reserves the right to elicit opinion testimony from Brent Slone's treating healthcare providers and rely on the facts or opinions documented in their treatment records and/or deposition testimony.

5. Defendant reserves the right to call at trial any witness identified by Plaintiff as an expert witness, including Plaintiff's retained expert, Marc P. Orlando.
